IAPD Best of the Best — Power of the Parks Award



The Best of the Best. Power of the Parks Award recognized IAPD member Park District, Forest Preserve, Conservation, Recreation or Special Recreation agencies that displayed innovative and insightful ways to pivot their programs, events and services for their residents during the Covid-19 pandemic.

In mid-March 2020, when the Covid-19 pandemic forced a shutdown of park districts across the state, the Mokena Park District switched gears and created the "Home But Not Alone" initiative. This effort consisted of web pages, Covid-19 resources, facebook pages, virtual programming, virtual events, a YouTube channel, contests, drive-in movies and community outreach.

Coronavirus Relief Funds

Mokena Park District received a grant in the amount of approx. \$68,000 from the Will County Cares Act and the Corona-virus Relief Fund to offset unbudgeted Covid-19 expenses.

New Financial and Payroll Software

The financial and payroll software of the Park District became obsolete and no longer supported. It was the original accounting software of the Park District (when the District moved from paper to computer). The new software allows the District to operate more efficiently then ever before.


Updated Organizational Chart

New Employee Health Insurance is a Win-Win for MCPD and Staff

The Park District's employee health insurance benefits have not changed since the District started offering health insurance to its employees in 1997. The purpose of the change in the employee benefit was to find equal or better health insurance plans, offer a Health Savings account (HSA) PPO plan, save the District money, and to be able to subsidize the cost of premiums for the employee family members. The Park District changed health insurance providers which realized a savings of approximately \$9,000 per year, implemented a Cafeteria plan, and HSA accounts.

Main Park Maintenance Building Expansion

Construction started on the Main Park Maintenance Building Expansion project in September 2021. The maintenance building houses all of the parks maintenance staff and equipment and has remained unchanged since the 1970's when the park district only operated four parks.







Whisper Creek Park Ground Breaking

The Whisper Creek Park Ground Breaking Ceremony on September 14. Approximately 50 people were in attendance that included many residents from the area, representatives from the Village of Mokena, Mokena Chamber of Commerce, and MCPD Commissioners, staff and Foundation members.

- Whisper Creek Park is approximately 6.5 acres and will include many different amenities such as outdoor fitness equipment that will be situated along the walking path, Drop Shot, painted asphalt games, two half basketball courts, and a shaded playground.
- A Gazebo that is funded in part by the Our Fallen Hero Foundation in memory of Pfc Aaron Toppen.
- Whisper Creek Park is funded in part by a \$380,000 matching State of Illinois OSLAD grant (Open Space Lands Acquisition and Development) and is expected to be completed by late fall 2021.

- · New Deck on The Oaks Disc Golf Course Bridge.
- Gazebos at Grasmere Park and Hecht Park were painted.
- 18 Disc Golf baskets were replaced on the Course. The remaining baskets will be replaced in 2022.


New Paid in Full Discount for Memberships

Discounted Paid in Full memberships were implemented at the end of 2020. These memberships require a commitment of six months or one year, however, there is no enrollment fee and you pay less than you would if you

paid monthly for the same time frames. Current members are also able to switch to this option at any time.

From January 1– November 3, 2021, 220 members have taken advantage resulting in \$69,236 in membership dues.
